Prosopagnosia (aka "face blindness") is characterized by a deficit in the ability to recognize familiar faces. Children and adults with prosopagnosia generally have unimpaired acuity, IQ, and general memory ability, but struggle to recognize the faces of familiar family members, friends, and coworkers. As a result, prosopagnosia can have a severe impact on the formulation and maintenance of social relationships as well as learning and communication. Without proper screening tools in place, it may be decades before being identified, if at all. These two Webinars, on behalf of learners and adults with visual disabilities, deafblindness, and those with CVI, will include the following:

- What is prosopagnosia?
- What is the prevalence?
- What causes prosopagnosia?
- What are the symptoms of prosopagnosia?
- How can we know if the symptoms are due to the visual disability(ies), ASD, CVI &/or to prosopagnosia?
