## What is a vision professional and what might they do?

- Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments (TSVI)
  - o Teach a middle school student with low vision to use a magnifier to read a graphic novel
  - Teach a student with multiple disabilities how to use apps on a tablet to reinforce language skills
  - o Instruct a student who is blind to read and write braille, a life-long literacy skill

#### Orientation & Mobility Specialist (O&M)

- Empower a teenager who has low vision to read a bus schedule on an app or with a magnifier, catch the appropriate bus, and meet friends at the mall food court
- o Orient a 30-year-old blinded veteran with a dog guide to her new job site
- o Teach a four-year-old how to use their cane to move around their pre-school

#### Vision Rehabilitation Therapists (VRT)

- o Train an elderly man to identify, organize and label his medications
- Help a young woman select a coordinated outfit for a job interview
- o Describe to a blind individual how to safely remove a casserole from the oven

### What would I like about my job?

#### Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments (TSVI)

- o Enjoy work that is different, interesting, and challenging every day
- o Work one-on-one with children ages birth through 21 years
- o Learn from and collaborate with other professionals to maximize student success

#### Orientation & Mobility Specialist (O&M)

- o Instruct on one-on-one basis both indoors and outdoors
- o Empower and equip an individual with a visual impairment to re-enter their world
- o Enjoy free daily workouts as part of your job duties

#### Vision Rehabilitation Therapists (VRT)

- Use creative solutions to solve individuals' vision loss issues
- o Experience something different every day
- Make a major difference in the lives of individuals who have lost their vision

## Potential employment opportunities include (not limited to):

#### Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments (TSVI)

- o Individual public school districts or multi-district cooperatives
- o Residential schools for the blind

#### Orientation & Mobility Specialist (O&M)

- o Outdoor, indoor, rural, and urban environments
- Schools and job sites

#### Vision Rehabilitation Therapists (VRT)

- o Rehabilitation centers
- Assisted living and nursing home facilities

## How do I become a vision professional?

- Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments (TSVI)
  - Obtain a Bachelor's or Master's in Education with concentration in Visual Impairment or Blindness and teaching certificate
- Orientation & Mobility Specialist (O&M)
  - o Bachelor's degree (in any field), Master's degree or graduate certification in O&M
  - o Passing a certification exam is usually required
- Vision Rehabilitation Therapists (VRT)
  - o Bachelor's degree (in any field), Master's degree or graduate certification in VRT
